The Great Thanksgiving – Eucharistic Prayer for the Blessing of Animals

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Celebrant

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Creator of heaven and earth. From before time you made ready the creation. Your Spirit moved over the deep and brought all things into being: sun, moon, and stars, and every living thing. You formed out of the ground wild animals and birds of the air and entrusted them to our care. You rescued two of every kind from the flood with Noah and his family.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Francis and Clare, with earth, air, sea, and all their creatures, with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Ho - ly, ho - ly, ho - ly Lord, God of pow-er and
 might, hea - ven and earth are full of your glo - ry. Ho -
 san - na in the high - est. Bless - ed is he who
 comes in the name of the Lord. Ho - san - na in the high - est.

You are indeed holy, O God, and blessed is your son Jesus Christ, the true Passover Lamb and the great Shepherd of your flock. Foxes have their dens and birds of the air their nests, but when Jesus came into our world, there was no place for him to lay his head. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us, gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. As they are the body and blood of Christ for us, so may we be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. Like Adam and Eve, set us as caretakers of your Creation. Like Francis and Clare, set us alight with the fire of your love. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until we feast at the heavenly banquet.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. **Amen.**





