The First Lesson

Acts 16:9-15

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

Revelation 21:10,22—22:5

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will

be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



The banner hanging in the church today was commissioned by Reneé Kastanakis and Rick Bent in honor of the marriage of their daughter Emily to Tommy Corbin. Artist Colleen Hintz gives this explanation of her work: The banner represents the wildlife that inhabits the sacred space of St. Dunstan's. There is a young fawn standing, a raccoon ambling, a squirrel climbing the tree, and the fox and chipmunk rubbing noses -- the hoped for peaceable kingdom in your own backyard. Three different butterflies -- the monarch, cabbage, and blue morpho fly among the pink azaleas, dogwoods, blue hydrangeas, and daffodils that bring beauty and joy to the space. Two dragonflies flit about and are joined by the blue bird, cardinals, and pileated woodpeckers. The trees were made to look as much like the photos sent to me of the beech trees that grow in your yard. Notice the branch of the tree on the right reaches out to touch the tree on the left and the roots touch one another... "and the two shall be joined together and become as one flesh."
