


Opening Acclamation

The First Lesson Ruth 1:6-18

Then Naomi started to return with her daughters-in-law from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the country of Moab that the Lord had considered his people and given them food. So she set out from the place where she had been living, she and her two daughters-in-law, and they went on their way to go back to the land of Judah. But Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "Go back each of you to your mother's house. May the Lord deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. The Lord grant that you may find security, each of you in the house of your husband." Then she kissed them, and they wept aloud. They said to her, "No, we will return with you to your people." But Naomi said, "Turn back, my daughters, why will you go with me? Do I still have sons in my womb that they may become your husbands? Turn back, my daughters, go your way, for I am too old to have a husband. Even if I thought there was hope for me, even if I should have a husband tonight and bear sons, would you then wait until they were grown? Would you then refrain from marrying? No, my daughters, it has been far more bitter for me than for you, because the hand of the Lord has turned against me." Then they wept aloud again. Orpah kissed her mother-in-law, but Ruth clung to her.

So she said, "See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law." But Ruth said, "Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; Where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die, I will die—there will I be buried. May the Lord do thus and so to me, and more as well, if even death parts me from you!"

When Naomi saw that she was determined to go with her, she said no more to her.



Among friends gathered around a table Jesus took bread, and having blessed it, he broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying "This is my body which is given for you." In the same way he took wine, and having given thanks for it, he poured it out and gave the cup to his disciples, saying "This cup is the new relationship with God. Take this and share it." So now, following Jesus' example, we take this bread and this wine – the ordinary things of the world through which God will bless us.

Lord Jesus Christ, present with us now, breathe your Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that they may be heaven's food and drink for us, renewing, sustaining and making us whole, that we may be your body on earth, loving and caring in the world.

Making them whole for the good of the earth.


For bread and wine, this place and time, for the peace we are promised which the world won't destroy, for the hope of heaven on earth and the final song of joy.
