## The First Lesson

Deuteronomy 26:1-11

When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us." When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone.'"

Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him.'" Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone.'"

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with Mary, Dunstan and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

# Lenten Service Schedule

**For Sunday School in Lent at 9:30** we are using a series developed by Bishop Wright, "**Growing Up in Christ**". Here is his description of it:

Youth comes only once to us, but immaturity can last a lifetime! This may be especially true with spiritual maturity. So, what to do? Well in simple terms: desire to be a mature Christian; pray and ask the Holy Spirit's aid and guidance; dig into scripture and our church tradition and regularly apply Jesus' words and ways in every category of your life. This is what St. Paul had in mind when he said, "...we will no longer be like children...but growing in every way more like Christ." Or, to believers in Corinth, "when I was a child, I thought, spoke and understood like a child, but now that I have become an adult, I have put away childish things." The life of faith is the active pursuit, in partnership with the Holy Spirit, and other people in becoming more like Christ. This process of becoming, being refined and becoming sustains us until our mortal life is ended and we go home to live with God eternally. This Lent let us take a trip together toward new Christian maturity in response to God's invitation, for the refreshing of our souls and for the good of the world. In Christ's name, I invite you to the keeping of a Holy Lent.
